- The California earthquake of April 18, 1906 ranks as one of the most significant earthquakes of all time. The earthquake was felt from southern Oregon to south of Los Angeles and inland as far as central Nevada.
- More than (4.5) square miles of San Francisco burned and crumbled into a windswept desert of desolation.
- On this walking tour explore the remnants of this powerful earthquake and visit buildings that survived the quake and the rapid fires. Learn how properties were purchased, permits secured and real estate deals conducted in this time of economic turmoil and chaos.
- The local, knowledgeable guide will explain the historical importance of this event, the first large natural disaster whose damage was recorded by photography.
