## II. SECURITY NOTICE - IMPORTANT

In order to maintain security control over the hall and its contents, exhibitors will be permitted in the exhibit hall **one hour** prior to the opening of each session. Specifically, access can be gained beginning at the following times:

Wednesday and Thursday: 10:15 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.

For your protection, exhibitors are required to complete an “equipment security pass” when removing valuable equipment from the hall between Tuesday evening and Thursday evening. The security guard at the Hall D entrance will have these forms. No bags may be left unattended.

## III. SHOW COLORS

Booth Drape colors this year are blue and gray. Aisles will be carpeted in gray.

## IV. BADGE RIBBONS

In response to exhibitor requests, attendees will be identified by the following categories of ribbons on their name badges.

- “OPERATING COMPANY (Black)” - indicates attendee works for a company operating a refinery or petrochemical plant
- “EXHIBITOR” (Blue) - indicates attendee works for an exhibiting company
- “SPEAKER” (Yellow) - indicates attendee is a presenter in one of the workshop sessions
- “MAINTENANCE or EXHIBITOR COMMITTEE (Red)” - indicates attendee currently serves on the Maintenance or Exhibitor Subcommittee
- “SPONSOR” - (White with Gold lettering)
- “PRESS” - (Green)
- “Labor Relations/Human Resources”- (Light Blue)
- No ribbon indicates that the attendee works for a non-operating, non-exhibitor company (i.e. supplier, consultant that is not an exhibitor at this years show).

## IX. RULES AND REGULATIONS

These rules and regulations are to be construed as part of all exhibit contracts. NPRA reserves the right to interpret them as well as make final decisions on all points which the rules and regulations do not cover.

- A. Booth Configuration** Specific height restrictions exist for all booths. To promote fairness and avoid growing competition for height and visibility, there will be no exception to these rules.

***For 10'x10' and 10' x 20' Booths:***

- Within the area 5' forward from the rear of each booth, display material may be placed up to a height of 8' from the building floor, including the company sign.
- Within the area beyond 5' from the rear of the booth, all parts of the exhibit shall not exceed a height of 4' from the building floor and/or shall not impede the sight line of adjacent booths.
- Within the area 8' to 10' from the rear of the booth, display material may not be less than 2' from the building floor.

***For 20'x20' Booths:***

- Exhibitors must submit a detailed floorplan for the island booth indicating height and width of all display elements for pre-approval by March 8, 2010.
- Within the 20'x20' area, display material and equipment may be placed up to a height of 15' from the building floor, including the company sign.
- Signs or banners may not be positioned around the perimeter of the booth at any height so as to enclose and impede the sight line of adjacent booths.
- The design of island booths must allow access from all four aisles and not obstruct the view of adjacent exhibits in any way. In order to avoid possible on-site adjustments, please contact NPRA if you have any questions regarding your booth's accessibility.

***For all Booths:***

- No signs or other articles may be affixed, nailed, or otherwise attached to walls, doors, painted surfaces etc. Likewise, no attachments may be made to the floor or ceiling by nails, screws, or any other device.
- No signs may be hung from the ceiling.
- Exposed unfinished areas of the exhibit must be draped or carpeted to present an overall attractive appearance. If this is not done, The Freeman Companies will be instructed by NPRA to take necessary measures to correct the exposed area at the exhibitor's expense.
- Booths must be kept clean during open show hours. NPRA reserves the right to order cleaning services, at the exhibitor's expense, for a booth out of compliance with this rule.
- Monitors for video presentations or any other visual systems must not be placed in a position which exceeds the height limits as defined above or otherwise creates a hazardous situation.
- No exhibitor display items may extend into the aisle.
- Booth display items positioned so as to create a possible safety hazard anywhere in the booth must be moved.
- No platforms used as the base of the exhibit are permitted due to the tripping hazard created.
- Exhibits not conforming to these specifications, or which are objectionable in design, operation, or otherwise in the opinion of NPRA will be prohibited.

## **B. Enforcement of Rules and Regulations**

- Any violation of NPRA rules will be addressed as follows: When possible, a warning or compliance notice will be issued onsite so that the exhibiting company can correct a violation. Any exhibiting company failing to take corrective action in response to a warning or notice of violation issued by NPRA or its contractor, The Freeman Companies, will be subject to penalties, including but not limited to a penalty fee, exclusion from the current year's exhibition, deduction of points in the booth assignment process for the following year, and/or exclusion from future exhibitions

## **C. Booth Décor/Contents**

- NPRA shall have full discretion and authority in the suitability, placing, arrangement, and appearance of all items to be displayed within the Exhibition by all exhibitors. NPRA may require the omission, replacing, rearrangement, or redecorating of any item or of any booth, and no liability shall attach to NPRA for costs that may evolve upon an exhibitor from these actions.

## **D. Admission to Hall**

- An NPRA badge is required during show-open hours.
- WORK PASS badges are valid until 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 25. Official NPRA badges are required after that time.
- Only those individuals with exhibitor badges may enter the Exhibit Hall one hour before show open times. Exhibitors may not access the hall between the following hours:
  - Monday, May 24 – 5 p.m. – 11:59 pm
  - Tuesday, May 25 - 12:00 am – 8:00 am and 8:00 pm – 11:59 pm
  - Wednesday, May 26 – 12:00 am – 10:15 am, 1:15 – 3:00 pm, and 6:00 – 11:59 pm
  - Thursday, May 27 – 12:00 am – 10:15 am, 1:15 – 3:00 pm, and 6:00 – 11:59 pm
  - Friday, May 28 – 12:00 am – 7:00 am, 12:00 pm – 11:59 pm.
- NPRA will have sole control over admission of all persons. All persons visiting the exhibits will be admitted according to the rules and regulations of the conference as issued or amended by any authorized representative of NPRA.
- Anyone wearing an unofficial badge, or a badge defaced in any way, will be asked to surrender the badge and will be escorted from the hall.
- No one under the age of 18 years of age will be permitted admission to the Exhibit Hall at any time. Due to the nature of the show and liability issues, no exceptions to this rule will be made under any circumstance!

## **E. Booth Conduct and Activities**

- Displays and activities should be directly related to the products and services provided by the exhibitor in the regular course of business.
- Booth personnel must be limited to employees of the exhibiting company or its affiliates. Exhibitors are not permitted to use celebrities, models, caricaturists or entertainers.
- Raffles, drawings, contests, or similar activities of any kind, regardless of the intended purpose or winnings, are not permitted and no exceptions will be made. Therefore, **no fishbowls are permitted in the booths.**
- Give-Aways are permitted only when the item is of minimal value, available to all attendees, and not related to any type of raffle, drawing or contest.
- Distribution of any open food or beverage item is not permitted.
- Sales are not to be made nor orders placed at any of the exhibit facilities.
- Exhibitors must confine their activities to the space for which they have contracted, and may not distribute samples or souvenirs except from their booths.

- The exhibitor shall be responsible for the safety of all individuals participating in or viewing their display or demonstrations.
- NPRA assumes no responsibility for monitoring such activity, but instead reserves the right to order modifications or additional safety precautions if any such display activity appears unsafe. The exhibitor agrees to make such modifications or to discontinue its demonstration.
- No live animals are permitted in the Exhibit Hall.
- Smoking is not permitted in the Exhibit Hall.
- Exhibitors will not be permitted to behave in a manner that is, in the sole discretion of NPRA, objectionable.

**F. Exhibitor Representation**

- The exhibitor will name one individual as a duly authorized representative to have responsibility for the exhibit, and will accept and assume responsibility for such representative or alternates being in attendance at the exhibit throughout the conference.
- The authorized representative will receive all official correspondence from NPRA referring to the conference and will be responsible for communicating this information to exhibitor personnel.
- The exhibit booth must be staffed at all times during open show hours.

**G. Lighting, Noise & Audio Visual**

- NPRA reserves the right to restrict the use of glaring or irregular lighting effects. The use of flashing electric signs or lights is not permitted.
- NPRA reserves the right to restrict the use of demonstration equipment that produces a noise level objectionable to NPRA, attendees, or neighboring exhibitors.
- The use of audio-visual equipment will be permitted, subject to written approval by NPRA.
- Both audio and visual equipment must not infringe on neighboring exhibits in any way. Plans for using audio-visual equipment must be submitted in writing to NPRA by April 23, 2010.
- Live music is not permitted in the Exhibit Hall at any time. Each exhibitor is entirely responsible for obtaining appropriate licenses for its performances of any recorded music, and assumes all liability therefore.

**H. NPRA Entertainment Policy**

The Association policy on activities held in conjunction with any NPRA meeting is as follows:

- Meetings or social activities must not be scheduled so as to take registrants away from NPRA programs and NPRA-sponsored activities.\*\*
- Companies are asked to restrict entertainment outside hospitality suites to activities that do not include expensive or elaborate entertainment.
- Any company sponsoring a function to which 50 or more people are invited should outline its plans for advance approval by NPRA. In general, such functions will be approved if they do not take registrants away from NPRA-sponsored activities.
- All representatives of companies sponsoring hospitality activities are expected to register for the meeting; Hospitality suites shall be operated only by exhibitors and operating company members.
- Hospitality suites are expected to close by 1:00 a.m.
- Food, beverage and service personnel (bartenders, hostesses, etc.) must be obtained through the hotel catering department.
- Suite promotional activities are to avoid the use of elaborate entertainment, expensive door prizes, suite attendance solicitation by individuals who are not full-time employees of the sponsoring company, or other similar activities.



\*\*Specifically, golf outings may be scheduled on Tuesday before 5 pm and Friday after 10:00 am to avoid violation of this rule.

#### **I. NPRA Ethical Responsibility and Professional and Personal Conduct Code**

The National Petrochemical and Refiners Association (“NPRA”) has adopted the following “Ethical Responsibility and Professional and Personal Conduct Code” (hereinafter, “the Code”). Every member of NPRA, their designated representatives, and non-member attendees at all NPRA meetings and forums agree to abide by the Code as a condition of membership in NPRA and attendance and participation at NPRA meetings and forums.

The Code requires the following of all individuals attending NPRA meetings and forums:

- Adherence to the NPRA bylaws and the NPRA policies and procedures, as adopted by NPRA’s Board of Directors.
- Strict compliance with federal antitrust laws.
- Adherence to all applicable federal and state laws.
- Maintenance of the highest level of professional and personal ethical behavior while attending NPRA meetings and forums.
- Prevention of certain behaviors, including harassment, violence, intimidation and discrimination of any kind involving race, color religion, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, age, disability or, where applicable, veteran or marital status.
- Assurance that conduct at all times and in all professional and personal dealings with each other and other attendees with the highest level of integrity and courtesy.
- Sharing of knowledge and expertise as speakers at NPRA educational events and sessions whenever practicable, without soliciting or explicitly promoting their own organization’s products or services.
- Working to instill public and consumer confidence in the petrochemical and refining industries, its member companies, and its professionals, avoiding any action conducive to discrediting members of NPRA.
- Refraining from scheduling general attendance meetings, receptions or other events at times that conflict with substantive programming or social events at NPRA meetings without express written permission of NPRA.

Failure to abide by the Code may result, for the first offense, in informal censure of a company or individual by the NPRA Executive Committee. If violations of the Code continue after such an informal censure, a company may be subject to expulsion from NPRA, or an individual to exclusion from participation in NPRA activities, by the Board of Directors.

#### **J. Default of Occupancy**

- If by 12:00 noon on Tuesday, May 25, 2010, an exhibitor fails to register at the Exhibitors’ Service Desk and occupy any space contracted for but not canceled in writing to NPRA, NPRA shall have the right to use said space to suit its own convenience, including selling the space to another exhibitor, without any rebate or allowance to the defaulting exhibitor. Any unexpected delays must be reported to Mallory Jones, NPRA Exhibitor Coordinator at (202)441-5400 or the on-site NPRA office at the Henry B. Gonzalez Convention Center before 2:00 pm on Tuesday, May 25.
- If the exhibit material has been delivered to the booth but has not been assembled, NPRA reserves the right to remove the material and place it in storage.

- NPRA assumes no responsibility for having included the name of the defaulting exhibitor or descriptions of that exhibitor's products in the show catalog, brochures, news releases, or other materials.

**K. Subletting**

No exhibitor shall assign, sublet, or share the whole or any part of the booth space allotted without the written approval of NPRA prior to the conference.

**L. Suit-casing Policy**

The NPRA has adopted the following policy to address concerns about non-exhibitors soliciting customers in the exhibit hall.

*“While all meeting attendees are invited to the exhibition, any attendee who is observed to be soliciting business in the aisles or other public spaces, in another company’s booth, or in violation of any portion of the NPRA Exhibition Policy will be asked to leave immediately. Please report any violations you may observe to show management.”*

**Suit-casing:** Any activity designed to solicit or sell products or services to delegates attending a meeting, conference, or event without the proper authorization by the event sponsor or in ways that violate the rules of the event or exhibition.

**X. COMPLIANCE**

NPRA staff and the Exhibitor Advisory Committee will inspect booth layout during move-in.

- A. If the display is not in compliance with show guidelines, a Compliance Notice will be placed in the booth. The notice will indicate the action necessary for compliance.
- B. Failure to comply with show management requests may result in penalties, including but not limited to a penalty fee, exclusion from the current year’s show, deduction of points in the booth assignment process, and/or exclusion from future shows.

# XI. BOOTH VARIANCE FORM

The purpose of this form is to notify show management in advance of any potential violations of the booth specification requirements at this show. If you are in doubt about your display meeting these requirements, please submit this form with a detailed description and layout plan of your booth in advance to avoid on-site adjustments. These rules are adhered to strictly and in the interest of fairness to all exhibitors, waivers on the rules are rare.

Booth Configuration specifications are as follows:

### For 10' x 10' and 10' x 20' Booths:

- Within the area 5' forward from the rear of each booth, display material may be placed up to a height of 8' from the building floor, including the company sign.
- Within the area beyond 5' from the rear of the booth, all parts of the exhibit shall not exceed a height of 4' from the building floor and/or shall not impede the sight line of adjacent booths.
- Within the area 8' to 10' from the rear of the booth, display material may not be less than 2' from the building floor.

### For 20'x 20' Booths:

- Exhibitors must submit a detailed floorplan for the island booth indicating height and width of all display elements for pre-approval by March 8, 2010.
- Within the 20'x20' area, display material and equipment may be placed up to a height of 15' from the building floor, including the company sign.
- Signs or banners may not be positioned around the perimeter of the booth at any height so as to enclose and impede the sight line of adjacent booths.
- The design of island booths must allow access from all four aisles and not obstruct the view of adjacent exhibits in any way. In order to avoid possible on-site adjustments, please contact NPRA if you have any questions regarding your booth's accessibility.
